Sisters and brothers -

We continue in the wilderness of Lent.

Wilderness is the site of significant parts of the Bible. It is where Hagar goes with Ishmael, driven away, encounters an angel and calls the LORD: the one who sees (Genesis 16). It is where Moses encounters God in the burning bush, hearing that I AM WHO I AM (Exodus 3). It is where the children of Israel wander for forty years (Exodus 20 – Deuteronomy). The wilderness is the place where Elijah is fed (1st Kings 19), where God's voice shakes the creation (Psalm 29) and where the dessert shall rejoice and blossom (Isaiah 35 & 41). The wilderness is a place where God told Jeremiah that Jerusalem was his bride (Jeremiah 2). In the wilderness, John the Baptist proclaimed Jesus and baptized him. In the wilderness Jesus was tempted.

Explicitly and implicitly, the wilderness is the location for crucial elements of scripture. It is a place where we are laid bare, where anything that we could try to place between us and God is stripped away. The wilderness is the place where God is made known.

Much of human history we have tried to tame the wilderness, to civilize it, to bend it to our own designs. And yet human projects fall short: reservoirs run dry, forest catch ablaze, temperatures rise. The wilderness, in the Scriptures and now remind us of our shortfalls, that when we aspire to be like God that we will always fall short.
