What is a prophet?

A person who brings a message from God. Reading through the Hebrew Bible/Old Testament, most of these people are bringing messages that are focused on their specific time. For instance, Malachi, which our Monday group just finished, spends a lot of time talking about acceptable offerings of grain or animals at the temple. That doesn't mean much to us. However Malachi also talks about giving our best for God, caring for the vulnerable in society. That means a lot!

And while some of the last part of Malachi are future focused - that is oracles that Christians believe predict John the Baptist or are oracles about the future, a lot on the time of Malachi.

We believe that the Bible is living and active, sharper than any two edged sword (Hebrews 4:12). This means that while it has a historical context that we cannot ignore at the same time we believe that God's word is eternal. God's promise through the messenger Malachi, to look out for the vulnerable in society (Malachi 3:5) is one that we need to hear as well. It is a reminder that God comes to the unexpected (1st Corinthians 1:28).

Thus while society often talks about prophets as people who predict the future, we in the church look as prophets as those who bring a message from God. We see these people in the historical prophets but also figures such as Augustine or Hildegarde of Bingen or Martin Luther King Jr or Elizabeth Eaton. There are many people who bring messages from God - to care for each other and the creation, to be a voice for peace or those suffering injustice, to feed the hungry, care for the sick, clothe the naked.

Listen to the prophets in our midst, telling us the way to go.


