Friends in Christ -

What does it mean to be Lutheran?

We can answer this a few different ways.

One of these is ancestry. For your grandparents it might have been that they were from the Dakotas, or Minnesota or Pennsylvania, regions of our country with more Lutherans. Their grandparents may have come from Sweden or Denmark or Germany. The ancestry answer recognizes that Lutherans are often reticent to speak about their faith, to evangelize. For many of us, our journey to this group is because we were born into it, from generations of people born into it. Of course this answer doesn't say much about what it means to be Lutheran.

What does it mean to be Lutheran?

Another way we can answer this is in our history. Martin Luther nailed the 95 theses from the church door in Wittenberg in response to abuses in the Roman Catholic Church. Congregations at that point were generally administered from the Vatican. After the Reformation many secular leaders, such as princes, burghers and monarchs, appointed priests and decided on the governance. We can see in this the history of our congregational structure. But this answer also doesn't satisfy.

What does it mean to be Lutheran?


A focus on grace. We can talk about our ancestral heritage or our history but what is at the heart of Lutheranism is the focus on grace. Luther, Melanchthon, Franke, Katarina von Bora (Luther's wife) and all the other reformers focused on the radical idea that God's love was freely given, never earned. Grace is the gift of God to all peoples, is the gift that names and claims all of us. Grace upon grace upon grace. Grace forgives us and sets us free from all the sin that holds us, claims us for love and God's work. Grace isn't something that we earn, isn't something that we do, it is the everlasting gift of God's favor.


