#### Friends in Christ -

This year has been a particularly hard time to think about Advent. Ever since the breakout of violence between Hamas and Israel on October 7<sup>th</sup>, news reports have been focused on the growing conflict and casualties between those two groups. It's been hard to turn away from videos of explosions, refugees, acts of terrorism and sheer human misery.

Of course this is all occurring in the land called Holy by the three Abrahamic religions: Judaism, Christianity and Islam. It's hard for me to see the images of families cowering in kibbutz on Octoer  $7^{th}$  and not to think of the parents in Bethlehem, trying to protect their infants as Herod's soldiers carried out his orders (Matthew 2:16 – 18). It's been hard for me to see images of Palestinian families fleeing Gaza or to see the babies brought from hospitals and not to think of the Holy family fleeing Egypt (Matthew 2:13 – 15).

This reminds all of us that Jesus knows us in our joys and our sorrows, knows our grief and our pain. There is something profound in the God who knows us and has been there with us, in the God that joins us in our brokenness and sits with us in our grief. This year our Advent is a profound reminder that the world is full of sin and pain and that God is in solidarity with us. Our God, the babe of Bethlehem, mourns with families on both sides of the border in Israel and Gaza and with families all places of conflict. Our God with us joins us in our grief and promises, as prince of peace to rescue us from it.

So what does that mean for us? Should we sit passively by as conflicts embroil? Should we put our head in the sand and ignore the pain in the world around us? Should we say that this is a centuries old conflict and doesn't really affect us? Most assuredly no! Our faith and our God call us into the world, into the messiness and conflict of human life. An Emmanuel, God-With-Us, calls us into the painful places to the world, to embrace the suffering and speak out for the oppressed.

In a letter, dated November 10<sup>th</sup> (included on page 3, <u>please read it</u>), the Patriarch and others called for an active faith. Our faith compels us to advocate for pray for peace, give for those in need, and to invite others to our mission of mercy.

As it says in Isaiah 58:6 - 8, is not this the feast I desire:

- and not to hide yourself from your own kin?

  Then your light shall break forth like the dawn, and your healing shall spring up quickly; your vindicator shall go before you,

### PATRIARCHS AND HEADS OF THE CHURCHES IN JERUSALEM

#### Statement on the Celebration of Advent and Christmas in the Midst of the War

November 10, 2023

Each year during the sacred seasons of Advent and Christmastide, our Christian communities throughout the Holy Land take great delight in their preparations for the commemoration of the birth of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. In addition to attendance in religious services, these celebrations have normally involved participation in numerous public festivities and the large-scale display of brightly lit and expensive decorations as a means of expressing our joy at the approach and arrival of the Feast of the Nativity.

But these are not normal times. Since the start of the War, there has been an atmosphere of sadness and pain. Thousands of innocent civilians, including women and children, have died or suffered serious injuries. Many more grieve over the loss of their homes, their loved ones, or the uncertain fate of those dear to them. Throughout the region, even more have lost their work and are suffering from serious economic challenges. Yet despite our repeated calls for a humanitarian ceasefire and a de-escalation of violence, the war continues.


Therefore, We, the Patriarchs and Heads of the Churches in Jerusalem, call upon our congregations to stand strong with those facing such afflictions by this year foregoing any unnecessarily festive activities. We likewise encourage our priests and the faithful to focus more on the spiritual meaning of Christmas in their pastoral activities and liturgical celebrations during this period, with all the focus directed at holding in our thoughts our brothers and sisters affected by this war and its consequences, and with fervent prayers for a just and lasting peace for our beloved Holy Land.

Moreover, during this season of giving, we also invite the faithful to advocate, pray, and contribute generously as they are able for the relief of the victims of this war and for those in dire need, as well as to encourage others to join them in this mission of mercy.

In these ways, we believe, we will be standing in support of those continuing to suffer—just as Christ did with us in his Incarnation, in order that all of God's children might receive the hope of a New Jerusalem in the presence of the Almighty, where "death shall be no more, neither mourning, nor crying, nor pain, for the former things have passed away" (Revelation 21:4).
