Friends in Christ -

This is the last letter that I will write for the newsletter at Faith Lutheran Church. It is hard to say goodbye after nearly eight years, after you welcomed me into your congregation. It was an honor and a solemn joy to sojourn with you in our pilgrimage of faith. Together we have worshipped, studied God's word, gathered for fellowship and meals, baptized, buried friends and through all of it, proclaimed God's love through word and deed.

This is the last letter that I write for Faith Lutheran Church, but it is not the end of the story for either you or I. Both of us continue to be called by the Holy Spirit, to use our gifts to share God's love with a world in need. I am not certain where the Spirit will take either you or me. After all, this is the Spirit of gentleness and restlessness. We never know where the Spirit will take us. It drove Jesus in the wilderness (Mark 1:12), that compels the prophet to cry out (Isaiah 6). It intercedes for us with sighs too deep for words (Romans 8) and comforts us in our sorrows (2nd Corinthians 1:3). We never quite know where the Spirit will take us in our lives: but we know that God is faithful and will always be with us.

The Holy Spirit continues to call both of us to trust in God's grace and mercy, to go boldly into the world, to proclaim God's love through word and deed. I have said that I am taking the next few months as an unpaid sabbatical – to discern what the Spirit is calling me to. The community here is discerning their next steps as well. But whatever we go to, we go knowing that the Holy Spirit unites the whole Christian community into one. So we are all a part of the same family.

In 1st Corinthians, Paul writes to a fractured community about what has divided them. He says this in 1st Corinthians 3:6 – 9, speaking about divisions between this person in the community or another: "⁶I planted, Apollos watered, but God gave the growth. ⁷So neither the one who plants nor the one who waters is anything, but only God who gives the growth. ⁸The one who plants and the one who waters have a common purpose, and each will receive wages according to the labor of each. ⁹For we are God's servants, working together; you are God's field, God's building."

What Paul wanted to emphasize to the church at Corinth is that all are part of the same family of faith. Each of us have been given different skills and talents. But we are all working together for the common purpose.

There are no physical things I will take with me from Faith Lutheran Church. But there are a number of things that will stick with me the rest of my time here. You called me as pastor, invited me in your homes and together we journeyed in faith. You are the community where my daughter was baptized, you promised to support and uphold her in her life. I will also remember the sign that is on the doors as you go to the parking lot. "You are entering the mission field."

What happens in this building is great. Joyous worship, study and companionship, quilting and conversations. But this is the place where we are fed, nourished and sent. Sent as servants working together into the mission fields. God is not done with us yet.



God's Present, God's Future

As you no doubt know, Pr. Mark has discerned a call to step away from his service to Faith Lutheran Church. Our prayers and gratitude go with him.

Because we want everyone to be aware of some important issues related to the transition between pastors, what experts call "separation ethics," we ask you to read this carefully.

The Church Council and Pastor Mark have agreed to the following and seek your cooperation, regarding the positive future relationships among us:

- We will do everything possible to uphold the mission of Faith Lutheran Church and the positive quality of life in this congregation.
- We will recognize the need for time to adjust to the new relationships and will reach out in care and compassion to one another.
- We will honor the departure of the former pastor so duties may be relinquished.
- We will accept that Pr. Mark is expected to disconnect from social events, pastoral care
 and social media with our congregation and its members for the foreseeable future to
 create space for both pastor and congregation, and for all the emotions we will be
 feeling.
- We will honor the arrival of the interim/transition pastor by acknowledging their role as Minister of Word and Sacrament, and by seeking their counsel and leadership.
- We will, after our interim journey, honor the arrival of the newly called pastor by acknowledging their role as Minister of Word and Sacrament, and by seeking their counsel and leadership.
- We are aware that conducting pastoral acts (such as baptism, weddings, funerals, confirmations, communions) and defining ministry programs and leadership styles are no longer the prerogative of the departing pastor but belong to the transition pastor and newly called pastor with the Council and congregation.
