There is a quote from Annie Dillard that I think states this well: "It is madness to wear ladies' straw hats and velvet hats to church; we should all be wearing crash helmets. Ushers should issue life preservers and signal flares; they should lash us to our pews. For the sleeping god may wake someday and take offense, or the waking god may draw us out to where we can never return."

When we gather for worship on Sunday mornings, the Holy Spirit stirs in us. We gather celebrating the resurrection from the dead of the God become human, Jesus Christ, and the promise of new life for all of us. There is no ordinary time in the church, for all time is extraordinary in God.

What Does Part Time Mean?

At the congregational meeting on December 19th, the congregation voted to move Pastor Mark to part time. This was done at the recommendation of the council and Pastor Mark, reflecting the financial realities here at Faith Lutheran Church in 2022.

The council suggested that Pastor Mark get a week a month off, though he be here on Sundays (for this month this occurs on February 14 - 19). In some months, Pastor Mark will be available for pastoral emergencies – and only pastoral emergencies - during this time (e.g. January, March) and in other months (e.g. February) he will not be available (these will be when he is physically out of town). When Pastor Mark is not available, it will be posted in the newsletter and bulletin. Just to repeat – the newsletter and bulletin will share a number to contact in case of an emergency if Pastor Mark is unavailable. If there is no number, pastor Mark is available during these weeks off but only for an emergency.

At that same congregational meeting the past president, Charles Bonville, and the current president, Terry Virnig, asserted that our congregation needs to consider how to meet changing circumstances. This require bold thinking and bold action, guided by the Holy Spirit. We are all journeying in this together.


What can I give to Jesus On this special Valentine's Day? How can I tell Him I'll Love Him and follow Him come what may?
