Council Update

Is there a path forward for our church?

Beginning last April, church leaders and the pastor began a conversation around the long-term financial viability of Faith Lutheran, given that many faithful long-time members had died and COVID-19 made worship an ongoing challenge.

In retrospect, it was fortunate that a small well-organized volunteer team applied, qualified and received two federal grants on behalf of FLC specifically to pay for staff during the pandemic. Also, through the generous bequest of Nona Sabatka, some tech savvy members including Pastor Mark, our worship went online more professionally. We are now capably reaching home-bound members and others.

The hardworking TOMS, under the direction of Jon Aaberg and the property committee, keep the building and our campus safe and well-groomed. We were fortunate to have a gifted secretary see us through the last five years, and her sister has stepped into her shoes with grace.

But yet, there is a growing awareness of our situation as we face the realities of a decline in church attendance and support .

To give us all more time for reflection and a chance to reverse the downward trend, the congregation came to an agreement last December to decrease staffing in two areas:

eliminate the nursery attendant and reduce the pastor to three-quarter time. A lengthy budget and successful personnel processes were made possible by our treasurer Janice Lee Virnig and her committee, and past council president Charles Bonville.

Unfortunately, the council is condensed because two committees stopped functioning without volunteers (education/youth and stewardship), a key leader is currently experiencing significant health issues and a fourth councilor is unable to attend the monthly meetings.

The 'future' of FLC was debated in a fragmented way in 2021 as well as in the early months of this year. But under the direction of Terry Virnig the council could put it off no longer; the group invested the majority of its March meeting to more specific goals for the remainder of 2022.

Without much fanfare the council agreed that our overarching ambition is:
to connect to Jesus, one another, and the world.

Now to the tougher, less lofty goals and objectives

The council voted to pursue “Transformation” and “Partnership” scenarios in 2022. The final choice, the “Resurrection” scenario, is described as a recognition that the existing situation is not sustainable and would require us to celebrate the past, grieve the current and close entirely, knowing that God will have a “new thing” for us as scattered individuals. But there was no appetite for this direction by the council.

Transformation

Pastor Mark will coordinate devotional materials for all – not just councilors – for reflection on our future, emphasizing our collective contribution toward new vitality as the body of Christ in this place at this time.

In order to rediscover God’s purpose for us, we need to actively seek His will and direction and try very hard to listen. You need to be engaged in this activity. Transformation requires us to focus on one or two areas where we feel God is calling us in this community. It is the desire of the council for our people to encircle specific issues that “break our hearts” and call us to action. This also requires us to rethink all that we do so that overburdened volunteers can focus on what matters most.

The exact emphasis has not been established and will be decided upon us by all with information organized and presented by the council. John Berg and Kim Sass agreed to collect

ideas for your review from folks like the Boy Scouts; Love, Inc.; United Way of Linn County, etc. The new 'mutual ministry' committee, led by Gordy Gamet, will also lend a hand for ideas and suggestions to help move us forward.

In the coming year we will also refresh our worship and music. It was the consensus that our format has become stale and can be confusing to newcomers. By 'trying on' different styles we hope to appeal to a wider audience.

Partnership with other faith communities

You probably 'caught wind' of this scheme after last summer's discussion by the council. It's not going away.

The idea here is to engage in a shared ministry with like-minded worshipping Christians. What form it will take has not been decided. Rather, there are several ways FLC could head depending on which group(s) also have an interest in this – and in us. Pastor Mark has completed the behind the scenes work locally and with the Synod. The council is handing leadership of this directive to Mary Sabatka Gamet for more serious discussions and planning.

The council wants to set the stage and this is a broad overview of the lengthy discussion of the council on March 9:

FLC will pursue other church relationships
FLC will pursue transformation

We need your input, your involvement, your prayers. You are encouraged to talk to council members (listed in this newsletter) with your ideas and community passion preferences. We all desire JOY to return to our congregation. When JOY is mixed with thankfulness, we have a recipe to make a noticeable impact in our community. And we want to invite others to join us so that together we can become JOYFUL subjects of the Kingdom, and the King whom we so dearly love.

Our Cluster is currently without a Representative for Synod Council. If you are interested in completing this unfinished term (Extends through August 2023) please let Pastor Mark know.

The makeup of the Synod Council requires a combination of genders and classification as rostered or lay. To stay within the requirements, the person filling this position needs to be either a woman or a person that is gender fluid, and can be either a lay or rostered classification. Rostered classification includes pastors and deacons.

Individuals that are interested in doing this important work of the church, should have the time and energy to engage, and have talents that will benefit the synod.

Theology Pub

Pastor Mark is looking to start a group that meets monthly at the Barn for a theology pub discussion. He has a number of one page discussion sheets on topics such as Hell, Creation, Faith & Money, Sexuality, etc. Basically it would work like this:

Looking ahead at the weather, he would pick an evening when the weather was looking nice. This will not have a set night, instead it's going to be based on who is available and weather – on a Sunday, Tuesday, Wednesday or Thursday night (the barn is closed on Mondays). He will message the church and send texts to those who have expressed an interest.

KEY QUESTIONS from ELCA "Holy Conversation": Using attendance figures for the previous 10 years, chart your congregation's average attendance. Then use the following questions as a springboard for further discussion, answering each with a simple YES or NO.

1. Do we have a pattern of growth in attendance?
2. Will our trend of growth, plateau or decline allow us to thrive and develop ministry for the future in this place?
3. Can we maintain our own existence as a congregation and provide ministry in the community, synod, and across the ELCA?
4. Can we survive without some form of life support from bequests, special gifts?
5. Do we have sufficient numbers of people to volunteer for ministry within the congregation and outreach into the community?
6. Are new efforts in evangelism and Christian education feasible?
7. Are there sufficient funds and interested membership to do ministry within the congregation as well as outreach and evangelism into the community and world?
8. Are we experiencing the presence of first-time visitors on a regular basis?
9. Do they return for a second or a third visit?
10. Do 20-25% of our first-time visitors eventually join the congregation?
11. Is the congregation's main focus on outreach/evangelism?
12. Is the congregation striving to do more than trying to survive/keep the doors open?
13. Has the congregation grown in the last five years?
14. Do we have enough members to do ministry well?
15. Does giving in the congregation enable "Great Commission" work, or does most of the giving go towards maintenance and survival?
16. Are there young families active in the church?
17. Has the congregation maintained a good level of stewardship including several families (10-12) who tithe faithfully to the congregation?
18. Is the congregation willing/able to adapt its ministry and lifestyle in order to develop the ministries that will meet the needs of a changing community?
19. Is the present facility physically adaptable for use?
20. Can the congregation afford the repairs that are needed to use these facilities for ministry?

If you marked five or more answers No, we suggest you contact the Director for Evangelical Mission to discuss the trends that are revealed. If you marked eight or more answers No, this may suggest a serious condition of decline for your congregation. It is time to look courageously and honestly at your situation, and consider what options you have as a

Prayer for Spring

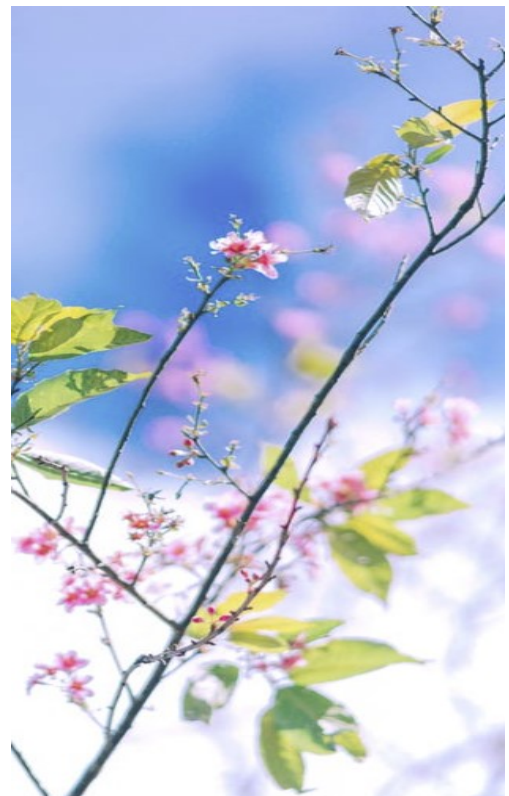
