2022 Oregon Synod Assembly Report

Thank you for supporting our attendance at the recent Oregon Synod Assembly. Mary and I both appreciated the opportunity to gather with fellow Lutheran leaders and congregation members and felt invigorated by the Holy Spirit to continue to nurture our own church's vitality.

This year our event was centered around Genesis 1:1-1:2 and the theme of "Ruah: Trusting in the Spirit Jesus Promises." Dr. Susan Abraham, a theologian from the Pacific School of Religion, provided the Keynote address and ELCA churchwide representative and Senior Director for Diversity, Equity and Inclusion, Judith Roberts presented on the work of ELCA Church wide activity.

Submitted Resolutions and Memorials Recommended to the Assembly 2022 were:

- 2022 Antiracism Resources Network
- 2022 Type of Assembly Meetings
- 2022 Reparations and Land Return Memorial
- 2022 Inclusive Call Process Resolution
- 2022 Just Transition to 50% Reduction of Greenhouse Gas Emissions by 2030 Memorial
- 2022 LEVO Support of IP17 & IP18

All submitted memorials and resolutions passed. Amended versions of theses will be posted as soon as they are available, as well as a recording of the whole Assembly, and other resources on the Oregon Synod website: www.oregonsynod.org.

Beyond the business of budget reports, memorials, and resolutions, we attended 2 informative Workshops: Pathways Towards a Hybrid Church, and: Pathways of Transformational Transitions for Congregations: Renewed Vitality, Ecumenical Partnerships, Holy Closure and more.

We learned from the Hybrid Church sessions that no one way is the best way. Each panel member has created their way of engaging in hybrid worships, bringing creative ideas including: worships that includes both the attendees in the building and the worshipers on Zoom seeing each other, preparing a whole worship on Thursday and having it available online for several days, or starting a Podcast. Bishop Laurie asked us to reflect: How has the Pandemic changed your vision of worship? We learned that investment in equipment, time from volunteers and commitment to trial and error is necessary as we continue to evolve and evaluate our own needs for hybrid worship, Bible study or other functions.

During the Transformational Transitions session, we discussed the Life Cycle of a Church. Many of us found ourselves in the "Empty Nest" or near the "Old Age" stage. Having the hard conversations, admitting problems, recognizing change is needed, asking for help, and then doing the work helps to determine the legacy of our church. We must have the intention of allowing others to grow, and trust the Holy Spirit to lead.

Attending the Synod Assembly is always a way to reconnect with God, the Holy Spirit, congregation around Oregon, but especially those who live and worship around us in our Cluster. The Vineyard cluster enjoyed sitting and learning together and agreed to engage beyond the Synod Assembly. Finding areas or ideas where we can work, support and discover together. Church Council Update

Pathways for transformation and partnerships

As you recall, FLC leaders and the pastor began a conversation more than a year ago around the long-term financial viability of Faith Lutheran because many faithful long-time members had died and COVID-19 made worship an ongoing challenge.

The increasing awareness of the FLC situation has given us all time for reflection and a chance to reverse the downward trend. Awareness also led to personnel reductions for significant cost savings beginning in January.

In March the council agreed that our overarching ambition is to *connect to Jesus, one another and the world.*

Work has begun on the tougher and less lofty goals and objectives

Pastor Mark offered (through the April *Faith at Work* newsletter) some spiritual devotional material for reflecting on our future together. Are you praying for FLC and the wider church? Your reflection and prayer can make a difference.

Nancy George compiled a list of all current members (as of April 11) so we have a more reasonable idea of 'who' we are.

Pastor Mark shared with the council at its May meeting that there are a number of people who are not able to attend church in person. He meets with as many as possible each month but would welcome help. Gordy Gamet, Jeanette Thorpe and Kim Sass participate in the "Mutual Ministry Committee" and are supporting our pastor as his hours have been reduced. (continued Page 5)

Please let one of them know if you are interested in using your unique spiritual gift of kindness and a listening ear for those within FLC who find it difficult to attend worship services.

Transformation

Transformation has led us to focus our church in one or two areas where we feel God is calling us in this community. It is the desire of the council to encircle specific issues that "break our hearts" and call us to action. This also requires us to rethink all that we do so that overburdened volunteers can shine our light on what matters most.

FLC supports many groups through our campus in direct and indirect ways. There are six specific agencies, however, where we give financially but are not necessarily involved in assisting them more frequently. In April, John Berg and Kim Sass presented a 'white paper' of all groups we support. (If you wish a copy of this assessment, let Kim know). When asked to narrow from six to one agency for specific philanthropic support, the council, using the multiple dot voting system, selected these two agencies for more detailed information: FISH (nine votes), Albany Helping Hands (six votes).

John Berg and Pastor Mark are following up with the two agencies in May/June. [It was also noted that FLC may have a contract with Habitat for Humanity and if we can locate that agreement and understand its details, we will need to meet with them to determine any future support since it was not selected by the council as a targeted higher need.]

Partnership with other faith communities

FLC wishes to engage in a shared ministry with like-minded worshipping Christians.

The council assigned leadership of this directive to Mary Sabatka Gamet for more serious discussions and planning. Pastor Mark and Council President Terry Virnig are also involved. In the last few weeks Mary had direct conversations with United Presbyterian Church (downtown Albany), Pastor Brandon Lewis; and St. Alban's Episcopal Church (Hill Street Albany), Father Bob Morrison and a lay leader. These actions resulted in:

- The exploration of a shared ecumenical community project, most likely in the fall
- The possibility of a Synod grant to underwrite parts of the community project
- With a nod from the FLC council in May, we will participate in a joint summer worship service with other churches in a local park
- Pastors Mark and Brandon will talk more about the *Theology Pub*, which both churches are sponsoring, and how those two efforts might be combined

We need your input, your involvement, your prayers. You are encouraged to talk to council members with your thoughts. We all desire JOY to return to our congregation. When JOY is mixed with thankfulness, we have the opportunity to make a noticeable impact in our community. And invite others to join us so that together we can become JOYFUL subjects of the Kingdom, and the King, whom we so dearly love.
