Friends in Christ,

This past summer we used a different worship liturgy for 12 weeks. We did this for a number of reasons:

- 1. Members of the congregation expressed an interest in varying worship and hymns.
- 2. We want our worship to reach out to visitors and friends by remaining true to tradition as well as the new.
- 3. The lessons are on a 3 year cycle, it is nice to hear from different parts of the Bible for our worship.

I write this because we have been using a different paraphrase of the Lord's Prayer and a different version of the creed. Why do we do this? Why not just stick with the same for everything?

Because people change. If you opened up Shakespeare, you would find language that doesn't really reflect the way you or I speak. If you opened the King James translation of the Bible (first translated in 1611) you might find that the language is different. Turn on the radio - or more accurately your streaming - and hear the music of different generations.

Some of our members would want us to use the old hymns, the old words, to never change. And if you think about - there are times are services are steeped in those traditions. We sing hymns like "Immortal Invisible God Only Wise" and "A Mighty Fortress" (the latter on August 21st for instance). We will be going back to the traditional Lord's Prayer this month. We try to reflect the preferences of those members.

Much of the council meeting in August was devoted to a report from Mary Sabatka Gamet as she coordinates a fall project to assist Albany's primary shelter for unhoused adults.

Albany Helping Hands has a large room used for a variety of public functions: serving as the shelter's living room, a library, a classroom. Mary was successful in securing a \$2,000 matching grant and our two church partners are being invited to donate \$500 each with FLC picking up the final \$1000.

The room will be painted, and a variety of tables will be added as well as two bookshelves. Artwork, white boards, a bulletin board and cell phone charging station will make the room as welcoming and useful as possible for the shelter's guests.

Mary will announce a date for the work party soon. If you are interested in helping out, do contact her or council president Terry Virnig. It will be fun to interact with our Presbyterian and Episcopal brothers and sisters in this project.

Goal met: 75 school supplies and backpacks for distribution to needy children are ready to be assembled and forwarded to Lutheran World Relief personnel. Many thanks to everyone who contributed.

Jan Wetzel could use your ideas for the upcoming November bazaar. The event will include lunch this year, just like the "good ol' days" so mark your calendar for the first Friday and Saturday of November. Unbelievable, but this event is right around the corner.

The **Property Committee** continues to assemble on Wednesdays. Their project to add internet capability to the conference room/library is just wrapping up. On August 23 members of the committee and Pastor Mark toured our campus with representatives of the Albany Police Department. The APD gave some good tips to keep our space safe and the council will incorporate their suggestions in the coming months.
