Dear People of God at Faith Lutheran Church,

Have you been watching the Paris Olympics? I have. It has been fun to see how creative the Opening Ceremonies were, and that we maybe learned that "not everything is about us." Thinking about the whole uproar over a Greco-Roman culture and beliefs portrayal, mistaken as "mocking" or "denigrating" the Last Supper by Da Vinci. Some people are on high alert for offenses. If Jesus had come in our time, he would have been found building community with the outsiders and excluded children of God, and we would have been offended by that.

Back to the Olympics...To watch the amazing athletes, representing their nations, engage in competition in their sport, having put in hours upon hours of hard work to perfect their routines, their plays, their plans, has been breath-taking. The variety of people, horses, team uniforms, venues, and spectators has reminded me that the world God loves so very much is filled with diversity and beauty and possibility.

Every Olympics I think of all the nations of the world participating, coming together in good sportsmanship, and the friendships made that reach across all boundaries for the sake of well-being and friendly competition. It is a recognition that we inhabit a world filled with variety of culture, skin color, beliefs, practices, economics, politics, and education. One planet, many creatures. Our needs are common, yet diverse.

War and other divisions damage this beautiful variety of one, of community, of global interrelations. The Olympic Games gives me hope. Even for two weeks. That maybe one day we will "get it" and live peaceably. God loves the whole world, and Christ Jesus invites Christians to do the same—love the whole world.

In this election year, it is important that we think about this as we exercise our right to vote. That we would, in good global citizenship, consider the rich variety of God's people around us, listen to the needs, and build the Kingdom of God in this place in a way that shares God's love with all. The only competition in the Reign of God is to outdo one another in showing love and honor.

Notes from Church Council:

Mary, Terry, George and I had a second meeting with the leadership from Good Shepard Lutheran and it went very well. They are excited to continue meeting and working with us to see how we can come together to do God's work.

We identified a couple of ways we can work together right away; Quilting at Faith, the Weekly Meal Project at Good Shepherd and a combined "God's Work, Our Hands" project at Luther House in September.

Good Shepherd has invited our membership to join with them for their on-going Wednesday Meal Service Project. Through this community ministry, they prepare 180-200 sack dinners each week for pick up (or delivery if needed). These are available for all who request a meal. The menu will typically include fruit, vegetables, a main dish and a sweet treat. If you'd like to help, volunteers begin prepping the meals at 1:00pm each Wednesday and distributing meals from 5:00pm—6:00pm. There is no need to sign up to volunteer ahead of time—you can stay the whole time, or for an hour or two. Drivers for deliveries are also needed.

Annual School Supply Drive

Sales will begin soon in local stores so it's the perfect time to begin collecting items for the Annual School Supply Drive. Education is important for any community, but especially where poverty or disaster have limited the options for young people to reach their potential. School kits that contain essential supplies can help ensure they can continue learning despite the hardships they face.

We have set a goal for 75 kits to be donated through Lutheran World Relief.

ITEMS NEEDED FOR EACH SCHOOL KIT:

- Four <u>70-sheet notebooks</u> of wide or college-ruled paper approximately 8 x 10 ½"
- One 30-centimeter ruler, or a ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other
- One pencil sharpener
- One <u>blunt scissors</u> (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)
- One 2 ½ inch pink eraser
- Five unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers; secure together with a rubber band
- Five <u>ballpoint pens</u> (no gel ink); secure together with a rubber band
- One box of 16 or 24 crayons
