Dear People of God at Faith Lutheran Church,

25 September 2024

May God's grace carry you in the peace of Christ Jesus.

This is a progress report, recapping the good work that is being done by you, by those members able to stay after worship to discern God's call to Faith Lutheran Church (FLC). The work of churches in transition is to answer Three Key Questions: Who are you? Who is your neighbor? And what is God calling you to be and do? These are answered looking at the congregation's history, leadership, connections, and mission, and from all that to discern the future path. Here's what has been done at Faith since May:

May

Began to look at FLC's history, mission and connections as well as Oregon, US and world history that impacted FLC's ministry since 1950;

<u>June</u>

We remembered leaders, both clergy and laity, who have guided and led FLC through a variety of eras and decades of mission and connections (relationships); what the qualities of a good leader are; how FLC connected in the neighborhood and community;

July

The work explored who FLC has been in the past and who you are at this time; we talked about our definitions of "church" and "mission" and looked at the Mission Statement you crafted some time ago: Living in God's grace, we share the love of Jesus with all. And we wondered together what God's invitation to FLC for the future. Included in that work was a Congregational Life Cycle graphic that showed a bell curve and what it would take to redefine, redevelop or enter into rebirth. All of which takes discernment and consensus going forward. No decisions were made at that time, as we did not discuss or brainstorm the possibilities;

<u>August</u>

The focus was on FLC's Core Values for this time. This is about answering the Key Questions of Identity—Who Are You, FLC? In order to answer that question, we needed to identify what is at the heart of who you are right now. The outcome of those discussions are these four values are core to who FLC is today: A community of Caring, Stewardship, Technology, and Prayer. Knowing who you are right now will assist in discerning the future;

September

Listening to the Holy Spirit, we began to brainstorm what possibilities could be Fait's future path. NO DECISIONS WERE MADE. We shared what was on our hearts. Some of that includes some grief. Anticipating change invites grief over the what may take place. We have NOT talked through any of these options. We are sitting with this list to let the Holy Spirit guide the process.

Here are the options lifted up by members of Faith on September 15:

- Join Good Shepherd Lutheran Church (this could be two different things: share pastor or merge—neither have been vetted with Good Shepherd)
- Sell the property (and find new worship space?)
- Develop the church property (Community Center for Assistance, Adult Day Care, Assisted Living, Low-Income Housing, or razing the buildings for new construction);
- Rent out space to generate more income
- Find a new Pre-school tenant

Other possibilities for consideration, which were not brought up nor discussed, are:

- Holy Closure-Legacy (close FLC and sell the property and disburse the assets)
- Continue as is and dwindle away, unable to afford anything more than guest pastors on Sundays, FLC taking care of everything else
- Nesting (Selling the property, going together to another ELCA congregation for worship for a period of time, then attending to another ELCA congregation for a period of time, etc. but never becoming members at any)

Now is the time to enter into communal discernment. Discernment is about listening, to the Holy Spirit's whispers, to each other, to consider outcomes, to ponder possibilities, and to be courageous in vision. It is praying to understand God's desires from and for FLC. We will always want to have God's will match ours. However, in these days we must listen for God's will, whatever will bring forth the good news, that shares the love of Jesus with all.

The decision-making process must be inclusive and prayerful. The Council will come with a proposal (when?) which has been lifted up by our deliberations. There will be some time to further discuss, and then a congregation meeting will be called for a certain date (TBD) and then a congregation vote can take place.

I have heard from some of you that you are tired, and want to make a decision soon. You have been doing good and necessary work in this transition. Please make plans to attend the October 13 Potluck, as we will dive into the above list of options, look at pros and cons, and maybe recommend to Council what to do next. They will next meet October 14. Continue to pray about God's invitation for the future.
