Dear People of God at Faith Lutheran Church,

Autumn greetings in the name of our Lord Jesus, the One who is faithful and enlivens God's grace for the whole world.

Outside the living room window is one tree that has decided to turn color ahead of every other tree in that area. They are all wild cherry trees. While I am not sure while that one is ahead of all the others, it is definitely reminding me that fall is here, as is natural, and a lot of things are changing. Not the least of which includes each one of us.

Change can be a natural happening, but it can also be a deliberate thing. Sometimes change comes out of necessity, sometimes from crisis, and sometimes out of curiosity. I think change that comes from crisis is the most challenging and also has the best opportunity to bring about healthy, positive change.

The political violence in our country that we have been seeing, experiencing, has been disturbing. Tensions have elevated to beyond boiling point. Divisions, disagreements, and discussions have been failing. Why? One reason might be that we have forgotten how to listen to each other. Really listen to each other, not to debate but to understand. It is easy to fall into debate to change another's perspective. But that does more harm than good.

Listening could change the temperature of the current political climate. Maybe that's my simplistic, hopeful, Pollyanna-ish heart. I am guilty of letting my emotions and perspectives keep me from really listening. To be honest, what I hear already is distressing and doesn't square with what I hear from Jesus. He is my center, my ground, my faith. His teachings are what I cling to and work at living out.

White Christian Nationalism is an affront to the life and teachings of Jesus Christ. There is nothing that I hear that even comes close to matching Jesus' loving ways. I reject everything WCN stand for. But what if I listen deeper? Will I hear their fears? Their pain? Their perspectives? And will I hold back my emotional reactions to the things I believe are warped and twisted away from Jesus to acknowledge their fears and pains, even if I think they are way off?

Jesus calls us to change our focus from ourselves to the well-being of those who need support, who live on the margins of society, who are imprisoned by the oppressive systems in our country, and the world. A follower of Jesus seeks what is good for all, not some, the way Jesus did.

Many of the gospel readings in September were about the lost being found; about who is valued by God; about what you value which exposes your heart. Just as parents are entrusted with the care and nurture of their children, we are entrusted with the care and support of our neighbors, including those with needs which they cannot bear themselves. How does this mandate from Jesus change us, our lives, our politics?

Change is always in season for us, not only in the fall. As Faith Lutheran and Good Shepherd Lutheran churches begin to bear the fruit of love in turning toward each other in shared mission and ministry, let us engage in the deep listening that is needed so that the fruit of love can be shared, in Jesus' name.
