Dear People of God at Faith Lutheran Church,

God's grace be with you in Christ Jesus,

In these final days of the Church Calendar year, the Scripture readings are about end times. And often it sounds scary. Yet in those readings, there are also new beginnings. And the Church Calendar ends with Christ the King Sunday, when we profess the God-with-us as the One who is first in our lives. Jesus, who lived among us and was crucified by powers not turned to God, we say reigns over and in God's holy creation.

Dear ones of Faith Lutheran, endings and beginnings happen all the time. This is good and necessary. During your time of transition, good work that you have done, you have come to the realization that you cannot continue in the same way as before. You have known for a long time that Faith Lutheran cannot afford a full-time pastor. You recognize that the smaller, aging membership does not have the same capacity as before the pandemic. And even then, church life has not been the same as several decades before 2019. These are hard realizations. There is no blame, no pointing to reasons why. Simply put, the times have been changing around us and in the Church. You have faced these facts and are turning toward God's invitation to see something new and different.

So, a new beginning has been coming into view: shared ministry with Good Shepherd. What this will look like is up to both congregations, with both lay leadership and Pastor Cindy. What I know about Pastor Cindy is that she is wonderfully equipped, has an openness to see and hear the possibilities, and a heart for Christ's mission in Albany, with you all. This is a great beginning which God has created and you have responded.

Soon will be the congregational meeting to vote on budget and the Letter of Agreement with Good Shepherd, which defines the Shared Ministry relationship. I encourage you to engage with all the opportunities God is presenting, through the listening season and in coming conversations with each other, listening for the Holy Spirit's inspiration.

This means that my time with you will be ending soon. Like Mary Poppins, I came in on the winds of the Spirit, and will leave on the winds of the Spirit, having completed my time with you. That will happen in December. My time with you has been good, I have learned things from you all, and we have worshiped God, done good work, and celebrated the 75th milestone of God's faithfulness and yours as Faith Lutheran Church. You have become part of my spiritual DNA and I will continue to hold you in my prayers.


